

Assessment and Feedback during Remote Learning

Effective feedback is a vital part of pupils' learning and can have a significant impact on their progress. Teachers at Codsall Middle School will provide feedback in a variety of ways whilst children are remote learning.

To receive the benefit of this, it is vital that pupils engage with the feedback they receive and act on the advice given. This includes if they are asked to make changes or improve their work.

How will my child receive feedback?	How will my child be assessed?
-Regular feedback will be given as individual written comments in Teams Assignments or Class Notebook. This will normally be weekly.	Online formal assessments will be carried out on occasion through the year (e.g. GL Assessments)
-Feedback from formal assessments, like pre-tests and post-tests, will be given verbally to groups in online classes. Individuals will receive scores and information on next steps.	Pre-tests and post-tests will be assessed and recorded
-Verbal feedback will be given during live lessons.	Teachers make assessments during lessons and from work completed that help them plan for the next steps in learning.
-Where extra support is required, pupils can ask teachers during lessons. Pupils can also contact their teacher via email for further support.	Pupils will be given the opportunity to self-assess through the use of quizzes and reflection on their work or feedback received.
